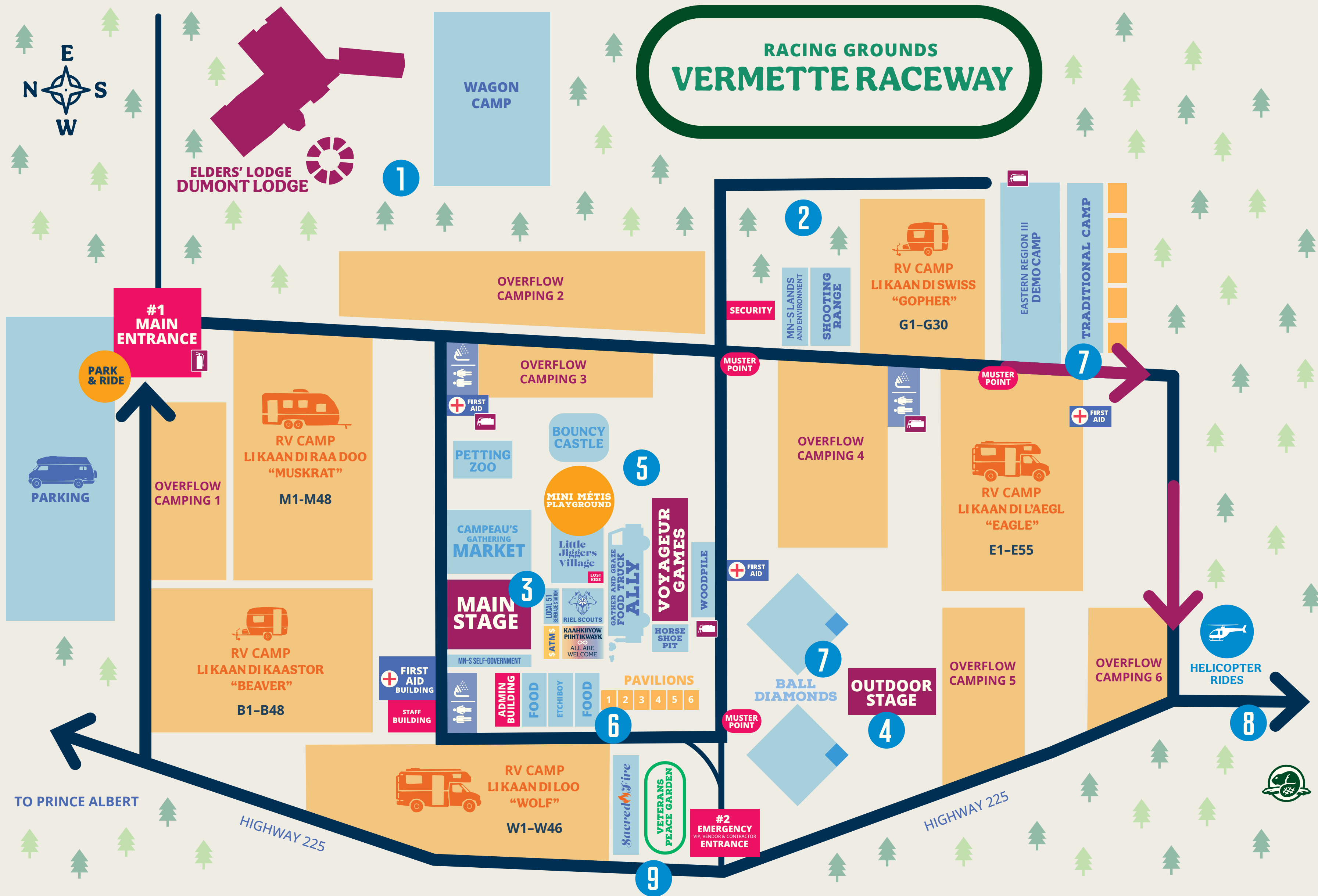

GENERAL RULES & SAFETY

- **Zero Tolerance for Violence:** Any form of violence will not be tolerated.
- **Emergency Procedures:** In case of an emergency, locate the nearest MN-S Staff or Security personnel, or proceed to the First Aid or Security Building.
- **Extreme Weather Precautions:** Be mindful of extreme weather conditions. Stay hydrated, keep cool, and seek immediate medical attention if feeling unwell.
- **Uneven Terrain:** Be aware of uneven terrain and watch for gopher holes.

TRAFFIC & ADMISSION

- **Traffic Regulations:** Follow designated entry and exit roads as indicated by signage. Maintain a maximum speed limit of 15km/h within Batoché grounds. Personal vehicle use on grounds is restricted, and parking is not permitted at Vermette Racetrack.
- **Admission Requirements:** Event admission bracelets must be worn.

TRANSPORTATION & CLEARANCES

- **Clear Roadways:** Keep roadways clear at all times.
- **Transportation Services:** Shuttle services are available for Saskatoon and Prince Albert.

PROHIBITED ACTIVITIES & VEHICLE USE

- **Prohibited Activities:** The use of ATVs is strictly prohibited. Personal golf carts are allowed with adherence to safety guidelines. Batoché Staff Golf Carts are for staff use only. No one under the age of 16 may operate a golf cart, and the golf cart operation manual must be followed.

ALCOHOL, DRUGS, & SMOKING

- **Alcohol and Drug Policy:** Consumption of alcohol and drugs is strictly prohibited. Medical marijuana is permitted with a valid medical card, but only at reserved campsites.
- **Smoking Regulations:** Smoking is allowed only in designated areas and campsites. It is strictly prohibited in buildings and outdoor eating areas.

CAMPSITE REGULATIONS

- **Campsite Regulations:** Campers must maintain cleanliness and adhere to noise regulations. Each campsite is allowed one trailer, one tent, and one vehicle. Slide outs must be within your designated campsite area. Second vehicles will be charged \$20 or will park in a designated parking area. There must be clear view lines through each campsite; no blocking or closing off is permitted. Use of tarps will be accommodated for protection from elements; tarps must not create safety concerns within the campground.
- **Camper Vehicles:** Camper Hang Tags must be displayed on interior of windshield. You will receive this upon entry at the gate.
- **Generator Usage:** Generators onsite are permitted between 7:00 a.m. and 12:00 a.m. and must be turned off when the campsite is unoccupied.
- **Fire Safety:** Fire pits must be dug a minimum of 8 inches and not left unattended. Firewood is provided onsite to prevent the spread of invasive insects, pending provincial fire ban regulations.

FACILITY USAGE

- **Facility Usage:** Washrooms have non-potable water and it is not suitable for drinking. Do not flush feminine products, paper towel, or anything foreign down toilets. Do not leave tap water running. Make sure toilets flush; if not working, please let bathroom staff know immediately. Shower areas are to be left clean; please don't forget your hygiene items/towels.

WATER & WASTE MANAGEMENT

- **Water and Waste Management:** Water truck delivery is available onsite at the camper's discretion and cost. No sewage dumpage is allowed at Batoché. Rosthern Provincial Park does have liquid and solid waste dump at park entry cost.

PROHIBITED ITEMS

- **Prohibited Items:** Fireworks, weapons, firearms, and drones are strictly prohibited.

LOST & FOUND

- **Lost & Found Children:** Located in Little Jiggers Village.
- **Lost & Found Items:** Located at the Administration Building.

PETS

- **Pet Regulations:** Pet owners are responsible for their pets' behaviour and waste disposal. Pets must be kept on a leash at all times.

CHILD SUPERVISION

- **Child Supervision:** Children under 6 must be accompanied by an adult.
- **Children under the age of 12** must be accompanied by an adult while riding the on-site festival shuttles.

PHOTOGRAPHY CONSENT

- **Photography Consent:** Please be advised that MN-S will be taking photos and videos during the event. These will be used at MN-S's discretion and will be the sole property of MN-S. By attending the event, you consent to the use of your likeness.

LIABILITY WAIVER & JURISDICTION

- **Liability Waiver:** It is a condition of your use of the premises and facilities and your participation in these activities that you assume all risk of personal injury, death, or property loss resulting from any cause whatsoever, including negligence, breach of contract, or breach of any duty of care on the part of the MN-S (including its employees and representatives). You agree that the MN-S shall not be liable for any personal injury, death, or property loss and release the MN-S from all liability and waive all claims with respect thereto. Negligence includes failure on the part of the MN-S to take reasonable steps to safeguard or protect you from or warn you of the risks, dangers, and hazards referred to above.
- **Jurisdiction:** Any litigation involving MN-S shall be brought solely within Saskatchewan and shall be within the exclusive jurisdiction of the Saskatchewan Court. These conditions and any rights, duties, and obligations involving the MN-S shall be governed by and interpreted solely in accordance with the laws of Saskatchewan and no other jurisdiction.

FAILURE TO ADHERE TO THESE CONDITIONS MAY RESULT IN THE RELINQUISHMENT OF THE CAMPSITE OR AN INDIVIDUAL'S PARTICIPATION FOR THE ENTIRE DURATION OF BACK TO BATOCHÉ DAYS.
